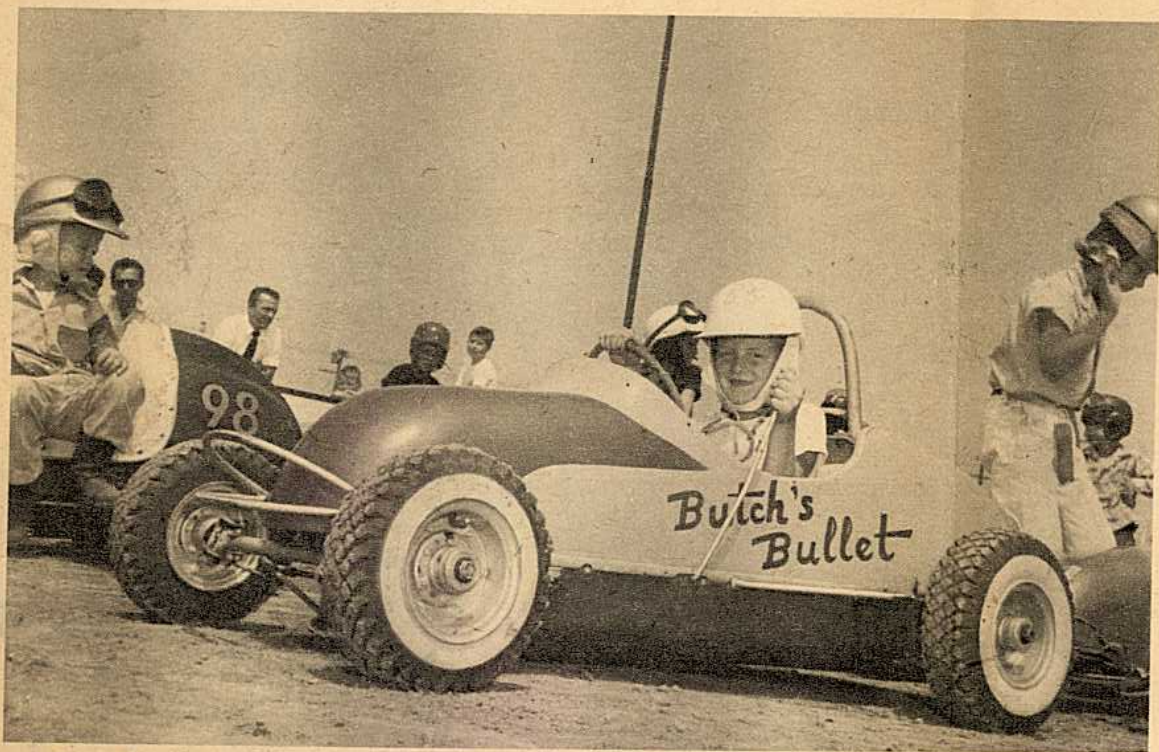
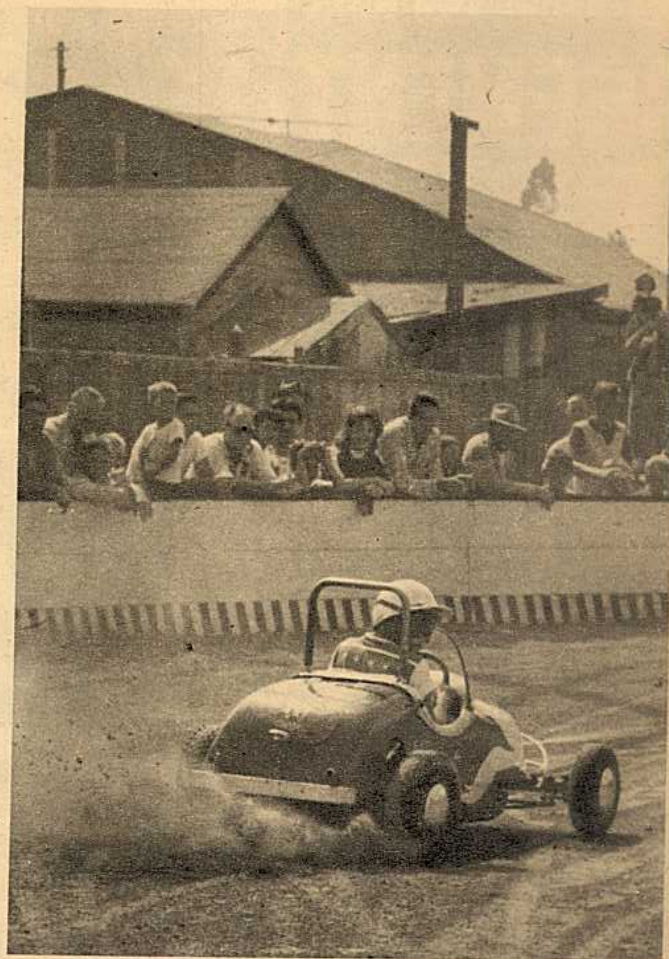


# Boy Hot Rodders

Youngsters from 4 to 14 years old who used to gaze jealously at grown-up hot rodders now have their chance to race around the oval track in Lawndale, Calif. Every Sunday 25 or 30 boys and girls wheel their little four-cycle, two horsepower machines around an 88-yard oval designed and built for them by local businessmen. The track, called the Jelly Bean Bowl, distributes trophies to the winners of the weekly races. Admission is free, but a hat is passed among spectators, many of them worried parents, for contributions toward maintaining the track and buying the trophies.

Miniature hot rodders roll around the Jelly Bean Bowl before race. Cars cost from \$350 to \$500 each.
